WHAT'S IN A NAME

The word "Aroha" signifies in te reo Maori the compassion, concern, empathy and love that is so vital to overcoming the challenges facing people and our planet today.



BEHIND THE LOGO

The symbol incorporated into our logo is the "Taniwha", literally signifying "shark" in a number of Polynesian languages native to the Pacific, but often representing a water-dwelling being of mythical nature. Taniwha are thought to have followed the vessels of Pacific explorers in many island to island migration, at once a menace and a guardian. We found the two-fold character of this interaction point of people and nature an apt symbolic analogy to global challenges facing the world today.

A WORD FROM THE TANIWHA

As Taniwha looks back on 2024, it's clear this has been a year of transition, momentum, and new frontiers. While the climate crisis continues to accelerate—marked by yet another year of rising emissions and insufficient national commitments—Aroha remains steadfast in its resolve to drive impactful and sustainable change. Governments may not have revised their 2030 climate targets, but securing a strong finance goal at COP29 was a step forward, even if the road ahead remains steep.

This year, Aroha forged new partnerships and expanded its impact, tackling critical challenges across sea, land, and ice. Working with the MSC Foundation, Aroha helped convene an expert coral workshop and supported new partnerships to advance ocean health - Taniwha approved Aroha also supported the creation and operationalization of the Macky Sall Foundation, an effort that will shape climate leadership, peace and sustainable development in Africa and beyond. In collaboration with Arctic Basecamp and key partners, Aroha embarked on a vital new project exploring the global health risks posed by polar change—because what happens in the Arctic doesn't stay in the Arctic.

2024 was a year of bold steps, but Taniwha knows they are just the beginning. As we move forward, Aroha remains committed to safeguard the world's most vulnerable communities and ecosystems.



HOW WE WORK

Aroha's mission can be summed up in three words: avert climate chaos. We do so by mobilizing actions towards limiting global warming to 1.5°C, enhancing protection of vulnerable communities and ecosystems, and maximizing benefits of the transition to a climate resilient future. Towards these objectives, Aroha operates in partnership with public and private entities.

WHAT WE ACHIEVED

2024 marked a year of new horizons and initiatives for Aroha. Thanks to the determination and dedication of our partners, colleagues across the globe and team members we were able to achieve the following advancements in avoiding climate catastrophe.

MSC FOUNDATION

- We supported the construction of the Ocean Cay Marine Conservation Center, to prepare for its inauguration in Spring of 2025.
- We facilitated the Experts Coral Workshop in Bimini, where 20 Bahamian and international experts collaborated to shape the MSC Foundation's 2030 coral conservation roadmap.
- We contributed to the expansion of the coral nursery at Ocean Cay, where fragments grew from 94 to 546, showing promising thermal resilience.
- We helped drive the MSC Foundation's new partnership with Mission Blue, advancing seagrass restoration in Spain with 9,000 posidonia planted around Formentera Island.

HEALTH & THE ARCTIC

- In 2024, we joined a global team of experts for the "Effects of Polar Climate Change on Global Health and Healthcare" project, highlighting the global risk of health outcomes resulting from polar change.
- We contributed to the communications and engagement strategy, amplifying the project's reach and making sure the science
- reaches policymakers in countries most affected by the health impacts of climate change.
- We coordinated efforts to develop a health polar layer added to the Climate Vulnerability Monitor (CVM3) Health Data Explorer, which we developed in partnership with the Lancet Countdown in 2022.

AN EMERGENT AFRICA

- We supported the launch of the Macky Sall Foundation for Peace, Dialogue, and Development (MSF-P2D), advancing its vision for an "Emergent Africa", a stable, peaceful, and sustainable continent.
- We developed the Foundation's strategy, corporate identity, and website, laying the groundwork for its mission and outreach.
- We coordinated the inaugural board meeting and the strategic dialogue at the UN General Assembly in New York, bringing together leaders and experts to shape the Foundation's strategy and objectives.

INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT

From our base in Geneva, Aroha maintains a formal presence at the center of multilateral discussions. This positioning supports our engagement with UN missions, governments, and international bodies, enabling us to remain connected to key global processes and policy developments.

Our proximity to key international bodies such as the Human Rights Council (HRC) and the World Health Assembly (WHA) provides us with unparalleled access to **decision-making forums** where critical discussions on global issues take place.

Aroha also holds consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and is an admitted observer organization to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), enabling us to participate directly in multilateral climate processes and reinforcing our advocacy for a 1.5°C-aligned, climate-resilient future.
